### **REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY**

**RESIDENCY:** The marriage license may be obtained from the County Clerk of any county in Wisconsin and may be returned to the Register of Deeds in any county in Wisconsin.

**CEREMONY:** The couple should have the ceremony date scheduled prior to applying for license. Any ordained minister, priest, Judge, Court Commissioner, or other person qualified to be an officiant may perform the ceremony. Couples are responsible to make their own arrangements. (Judges and Court Commissioners are listed on the back page)

MARRIAGEABLE AGE: Any person who is 18 years old can marry. If a person is 16 or 17, the license will be issued only with a notarized written consent from both biological parents, legal guardians, or custodians. Consent forms are available through the County Clerk's office.



### **TIME PERIOD FOR APPLYING:**

To apply, the couple comes in to the County Clerk's office 3 to 63 days prior to the ceremony.

**3-DAY WAITING PERIOD:** A waiting period of 3 days must pass between the date of application and the date of marriage (i.e. application on January 1 would be issued on January 5).

**LICENSE EXPIRATION:** The license is good for 60 days after the date of issuance and the marriage must be performed within the 60 day time-period. If the marriage does not occur within this period, a new application must be completed and the fees will be incurred again.

### **REQUIRED DOCUMENTS**

\* BIRTH CERTIFICATE: Parties are required to supply a <u>CERTIFIED</u> copy of their birth certificate. (NOTE: Hospital Birth Certificates and State Notification of Registration are not acceptable; they are not legal documents.)

**PHOTO ID:** Each party must present photo identification. (Examples: Driver's license, passport, school ID, etc.)

\*\*IF PREVIOUSLY MARRIED: Party must present a Death Certificate, State Annulment, or final Divorce Decree. In Wisconsin, divorced person(s) may not remarry until 6-months after the granting of the Judgment of Divorce, regardless of where the action took place.

**SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS:** Each party must provide the County Clerk's Office with their Social Security number. It is not necessary to bring the actual card, as long as you know the number.

- \* CERTIFIED DOCUMENTS FROM THE REGISTER OF DEEDS: Copies of Birth Certificates, Death Certificates and Marriage Certificates are available in the County in which the event occurred. The fee in Wisconsin is \$20 for the first copy and \$3 for each additional copy at the time of purchase.
- \*\* DIVORCE DECREES FROM CLERK OF COURTS: Copies of final Divorce Judgments are available from the Clerk of Court in the County in which the event occurred.

### **OTHER INFORMATION**

**SIGNATURES:** Both parties must sign the marriage license application in the presence of the County Clerk or staff.

**FEES:** The license application fee is \$90. However, a \$25 waiver fee is charged if, for good cause, the marriage license needs to be released before the expiration of the 3-day waiting period. (Military, out-of-state, school, illness, etc.)

### APPLICATION CHECKLIST

After the ceremony date is scheduled, couple may apply for license between 3-63 days prior to ceremony. Bring address of where the ceremony will take place.
Officiant Information: Name, address and phone number
Certified copy of the birth certificate (Issued by the County or State of birth – NOT a hospital Birth Certificate or State Notification of Birth Registration)
Photo ID: (Driver's License, State ID Card, Passport or Military ID))
Proof of Termination of Previous Marriage: (Conclusions of Law and Judgment or Judgment of Divorce with Judge's signature and date, Death Certificate, or State annulment)
Social Security Number: (Card not necessary but must provide the SSN if you have one)
\$90 Application Fee (check or cash. Credit cards are accepted but additional fee applies): Additional \$25 if the 5-day waiting period is waived.
Parental Consent Form (if needed):

No Blood Tests or Physicals are required in Wisconsin for a marriage license.
