Nonmetallic Mining Reclamation Plan**

Notice is hereby given that **Haas Sons, Inc.** has filed an application to amend a Nonmetallic Mining Reclamation Permit to expand the Dusick site under the Chippewa County Nonmetallic Mining Reclamation Ordinance.

As currently permitted, the mine site covers approximately 14.2 permitted acres. The applicant proposes a 40.7 acre expansion of the existing site.

Location:     **SW ¼ of NE ¼, SE ¼ of NW ¼, NE ¼ of NW ¼, and NW ¼ of NE ¼ of Section 17, T29N, R05W**

Owned by:     **Matthew & Jodi Derks, William Savina, and Tom Dusick**

The applicant proposes to: **extract, crush, and wash sand and gravel, and to establish the post-mining land uses as shallow/deep ponded areas with grassland uplands. The proposed mine site will expand to cover approximately 54 acres and will be sequentially mined and reclaimed in progressive stages.**

Any person residing within, owning property within, or whose principal place of business is within 300 feet of the boundary of the parcel or parcels of land in which the nonmetallic mining site is located or proposed may request a public informational hearing. Requests for the public informational hearing must be made within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
