Items Not Accepted

- X Aerosol cans
- XAnything containing blood or bodily fluid
- Household hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, oil, gas)
- X Illegal drugs
- X lodine-containing medications
- Mercury thermometers
- Personal care products (shampoo, soaps, lotions, sunscreens, etc.)
- X Sharps/syringes
- ➤ Vape pens/e-cigarette devices with a built-in battery that cannot be removed
