Chippewa County Public Health Offers Free Sharps Disposal in May -**Promoting Community Safety**

CHIPPEWA FALLS, Wis., May 7, 2025 – The Chippewa County Department of Public Health is offering free sharps disposal throughout the month of May. This service provides a safe and responsible way for residents to dispose of used needles and syringes, helping to prevent injuries, protecting sanitation workers, and reducing the spread of disease in our community.

"As our community continues to feel the effects of the HSHS hospital closure, we are committed to providing meaningful support," said Chippewa County Health Officer Brittnay Fortuna. "Offering free sharps disposal is one way we can help fill that gap and keep our community safe."

This effort comes in recognition of International Harm Reduction Day on May 7, which promotes practical strategies that help reduce the risks and negative impacts associated with health challenges. Whether it's for medical needs or other uses, properly disposing of used needles and syringes protects everyone and helps prevent accidental injuries and the spread of disease. "The harm reduction approach seeks to offer **Support Without Stigma**, which recognizes that compassion saves lives, while judgment only deepens harm. Harm reduction saves lives, stigma doesn't," stated Planning and Promotion Specialist JoAnna Bernklau.



Sharps must be placed in **sealed**, **strong plastic** containers to ensure safe handling.













Research shows that when people are given safe and responsible options, they are more likely to take care of themselves and others. Harm reduction isn't about encouraging bad behavior, it's about meeting people where they are and giving them tools to make better choices, protect their families, and stay healthy.

Those in need of harm reduction resources or other personal care items such as firearm locks, medication disposal bags, Narcan, hygiene supplies, or outdoor safety kits are encouraged to utilize the Public Health Kiosk located at the Chippewa County Jail at 50 Spruce St., Chippewa Falls, Wl. All items are free and available 24 hours a day.
