

#### Sale Area Description:

This sale will be a clear-cut to transition this stand to aspen and hardwood. With areas of row thinning and marked thinning. The boundaries of this sale are not marked. Purple paint line marks the transition between harvest methods represented on the map. No equipment is allowed to operate past one machine width outside of the species transition from conifer to hardwood. The sale is located on the Christmas Creek Game Trail or 350<sup>th</sup> ave.

#### **Cutting Requirements:**

<u>Clear Cut Areas</u>: (74 acres) harvest all stems 1" DBH and greater. **Do Not Cut** green marked

trees, Tamarack or sale boundary trees (Purple and Blue)

Row Thin Areas: (15 acres) Cut every third row **Do Not Cut** Property boundary trees (Blue)

Marked Thin Areas: (5 acres) Cut all trees marked with orange paint. **Do Not Cut** sale boundary

trees (Purple)

#### **Special Conditions:**

- The contract length is 2 years.
- Frozen Ground restrictions apply
- No harvesting activity will be allowed if rutting occurs.
- Leave all snags (dead trees) unless they present a safety hazard. Use caution to limit the disturbance of Course Woody Debris (CWD) on the forest floor. (ie) down logs greater than 12 inches in diameter.
- All hardwood logs, 10" or larger on the small end will be charged at the appropriate saw log stumpage rate.
- All cordwood shall be utilized to a 4" top diameter.
- All slash must lie within two feet of the ground.
- All logging debris must remain within the sale boundaries and kept from wetlands and trails.
- All landing locations must be approved by the county.
